From the Desk of the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

On May 5th, thanks to the magic of Zoom the parish pastoral council, parish staff and representative leaders from each of our parish commissions and committees, met to discuss plans for the future of our parish community and also discuss how each of the parish commissions and committees could collaborate more effectively with each other. On June 9th, the Parish Pastoral Council met to consider the fruits of that meeting and next steps.

I thought I would share with you the prayer I wrote to begin that meeting. It was an adaptation of the prayer I wrote for our May 5th meeting.

As a parish faith community coming slowly, and hopefully steadily, out of the isolation of the past 14 months, perhaps we can adapt elements of this prayer as we pray for our parish and its future direction in the months ahead.

Let us pray:

God of all good gifts, we gather before you this night as the Parish Pastoral Council of St. Ignatius. You know how the ongoing global pandemic has kept us physically apart, keeping us

parishioners in our parish community.

Still, we feel blessed that through technology you have allowed us last month to see and share with one another to get an overview of the immediate past, present and future of our parish from the perspectives of the leadership of our various parish commissions and committees.

Please send forth the Holy Spirit as we review tonight the thoughts, ideas and recommendations we had heard.

Help us always to embody a spirit of listening, a spirit of synodality, so that no one singular perspective dominates. Instead inspire us to join together all of their and our perspectives so that they become seeds for discernment, for reconsidering our understandings, for enlarging our point of view and for coming to consensus so that, during this upcoming Ignatian year, we may "see all things new in Christ."

Help us to use this upcoming Ignatian Year to focus more fully on the implementation of the Four Jesuit Universal Apostolic Preferences:

Showing the Way to God
Walking with the Excluded
Journeying with Youth
Caring for our Common Home

Welcoming you back!

We continue to welcome back parishioners and are thankful we can worship together again at St. Ignatius. We would like highlight some of the new protocols. Our hope with these protocols is to keep everyone SAFE!

- We ask that everyone, except for those who need the handicap entrance, to enter through the main front doors of the Church.
- If you are fully vaccinated (i.e., two weeks since the completion of your second dose of Pfizer or Moderna or single dose of J&J), you are welcome to sit in the front two sections of the Church where masks are optional.
- The back half of the Church will continue to require wearing masks, 6-foot physical distancing, and seating in every other pew for those unvaccinated (which includes families with children under 12 years of age)

anyone who prefers a safe space to worship.

- At Communion, the front half of the Church will now be come forward in a double line. The back section will come forward to the break in a single line with spacing.
- It is important that no one leaves the Church and depart in an orderly fashion regardless of where you are sitting. Please wait until the conclusion of the singing of our final hymn when you will be directed by our

ushers. The front section should not go out the main front doors but the side doors as directed.

 For the continued safety of all, the cantor will instruct you to remain in your place until you are directed by the ushers. The front sections will depart by the side doors, starting with the first pew. The back sections will depart by the main doors, starting with the last pew.

¡Dándoles la bienvenida de nuevo!

Continuamos dando la bienvenida de nuevo a los feligreses y estamos agradecidos de que podamos celebrar juntos de nuevo en San Ignacio. Nos gustaría destacar algunos de los nuevos protocolos. ¡Nuestra esperanza con ellos es mantenernos todos SEGUROS!

- Pedimos que todos, excepto los que necesitan. la entrada para discapacitados, entren por las puertas principales de la Iglesia.
- Si está completamente vacunado (es decir, dos semanas después de su segunda dosis de Pfizer o Moderna o la dosis única de J&J), le invitamos a sentarse en las dos secciones delanteras de la Iglesia donde las máscaras son opcionales.
- La mitad trasera de la Iglesia seguirá requiriendo el uso de máscaras, distanciamiento físico de 6 pies y asientos en cada dos bancas para aquellos no vacunados (lo que incluye a las familias con niños menores de 12 años) o cualquier persona que prefiera un espacio seguro para celebrar.
- En la Comunión, la mitad delantera de la Iglesia se presentará en una doble línea. La sección posterior saldrá al pasillo intermedio en una sola línea marcando distancia.
- Por la seguridad continua de todos, el cantor le pedirá que permanezca en su lugar hasta la conclusión del himno final. Es importante salir de una manera ordenada, independientemente de dónde esté sentado. Los ujieres dirigirán las secciones delanteras para que salgan por las puertas laterales, comenzando por el primer banco y las secciones traseras saldrán por las puertas principales, comenzando por el último banco.

Juneteenth

On June 19, 1865, more than two years after President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, the more than 200,000 enslaved persons in Texas discovered they were free. Union General Gordon Granger, coming to Galveston with a company of Union troops, announced the end of both the Civil War and of slavery. His announcement, General Order Number 3 reads: "The people of Texas are informed that, in accordance with a proclamation from the Executive of the United States, all slaves are free." Juneteenth, as the day came to be known, became a day for celebrations of freedom, reflection, and action.

Our Catholic faith calls us to speak and act against the evil of racism in all its forms. This year, as we celebrate Juneteenth, we must acknowledge the history and persistence of racism in our country and actively work to become anti-racist and end systems of oppression for all God's people.

The optical sorters that separate materials cannot "see" black or dark green plastics and they end up contaminating other recyclable materials. 
