Apostles' Creed



He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead.


I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.


Holy, Holy Mass for the Voice of the Soul



Memorial Acclamation Mass for the Voice of the Soul




Great Amen Mass for the Voice of the Soul
