David Attenborough: A Life on Our Planet

David Attenborough is a world-renowned documentarian who, for the past seven decades, has been bringing the natural world into people's living rooms through his work with the BBC. He describes his latest film, *A Life on Our Planet*, as his "witness statement." It is a very purposeful choice of words for a man of 94 that has dedicated his life to sharing the wonders of nature. He is explicitly stating that what humanity has done for the past century is a crime against nature.


The film opens in present day Chernobyl. It is an obvious and extreme example of a theme that reappears throughout the film: humanity has had a noticeable and negative impact on nature. Much like the environmental catastrophe at Chernobyl, climate change and the human lifestyle that drives it is turning the world into a place where we cannot live. Attenborough notes that by the late 1960's the scientific community began to realize that our resources were not unlimited.

In 1971, Attenborough met with a previously uncontacted tribe of people in New Guinea who lived sustainably. This tribe lived in sharp contrast with the world in which he lived: a world obsessed with consumerism. Viewers familiar with Pope Francis's encyclical *Laudato Sí*, will start to recognize the beginning of Attenborough's ecological conversion.

By the late 1970's Attenborough acknowledges that it had become increasingly difficult to find animals to film. The film goes on to highlight the destruction of other habitats and species: rainforests torn down for timber and farming, warming seas killing the coral reefs and the fish that live there, and warming temperatures in the arctic changing the landscape faster than the plants and animals can adapt. He makes an incredibly compelling argument that the world can't afford to continue operating with the status quo. Just in the span of one lifetime, wild animal populations have more than halved. Over half of the fertile land on earth is now farmland. We have unquestionably reshaped the world to our wants.

If we continue down this path, Attenborough maintains, a child born today will be witness to a series of catastrophic events and feedback loops that further accelerate the environmental decline. In the 2030s, the rainforests will see regular forest fires and arctic will be ice free in the summers. By the 2040s the permafrost of the higher latitudes will melt and release methane into the atmosphere. The 2050s will bring warmer, more acidic oceans that can't support coral reefs and the fish populations will plummet. By the 2080s the soil around the world will be exhausted and unable to support the projected 11

David Attenborough es un documentalista de renombre mundial que, durante las últimas siete décadas, ha estado llevando el mundo natural a las salas de estar de la gente a través de su trabajo con la BBC. Describe su última película, *A Life on Our Planet* (*Una Vida en Nuestro Planeta*), como su "declaración como testigo". Es una selección muy escogida de palabras para un hombre de 94 que ha dedicado toda su vida a compartir las maravillas de la naturaleza. Está afirmando explícitamente que lo que ha hecho la humanidad durante este último siglo es un crimen contra la naturaleza.



La película comienza en la Chernóbil actual. Es un ejemplo obvio y extremo de un tema que reaparece a todo lo largo de ella: la humanidad ha tenido un impacto notable y negativo en la naturaleza. Al igual que la catástrofe ambiental en Chernóbil, el cambio climático y el estilo de vida humano que lo impulsa está convirtiendo al mundo en un lugar donde no podemos vivir. Attenborough señala que a finales de la década de 1960 la comunidad científica comenzó a darse cuenta de que nuestros recursos no eran ilimitados.

En 1971, Attenborough se reunió con una tribu en Nueva Guinea cuyas personas no habían sido contactadas previamente que vivían de una manera sostenible. Esta tribu vivía de una manera contrastante con el mundo en el que él vivía: un mundo obsesionado con el consumismo. Los espectadores familiarizados con la encíclica del Papa Francisco *Laudato Sí* comenzarán a reconocer el comienzo de la conversión ecológica de Attenborough.

A finales de la década de 1970, Attenborough reconoce que se había vuelto cada vez más difícil encontrar animales para filmar. La película continúa destacando la destrucción de otros hábitats y especies: las selvas tropicales derribadas para la madera y la agricultura, el calentamiento de los mares matando los arrecifes de coral y los peces que viven allí, y el calentamiento de las temperaturas en el ártico cambiando el paisaje más rápido de lo que las plantas y los animales pueden adaptarse. Hace un argumento increíblemente convincente de que el mundo no puede permitirse seguir operando con el status quo. Sólo en el lapso de una vida, las poblaciones de animales salvajes se han reducido a más de la mitad. Más de la mitad de la tierra fértil en la Tierra es ahora tierras de cultivo. Hemos remodelado indudablemente el mundo a nuestros deseos.

Si continuamos por este camino, sostiene Attenborough, un niño nacido hoy será testigo de una serie de eventos catastróficos y ciclos de retroalimentación que aceleran aún más el

billion people live on the planet. Finally, by 2100 the world will be 4°C warmer, large parts of the world will be uninhabitable and a mass extinction will be well underway.

Fortunately, we are in control of our future. The film offers a way forward that is largely consistent with the Church's teachings and Pope Francis's *Laudato Sí*. At its core, the film states we must restore Earth's biodiversity – "rewild the planet." Attenborough says we need to "move from being apart from nature to becoming a part of nature once again." Similarly, Pope Francis writes, "We have forgotten that we ourselves are dust of the earth."

Attenborough's film, an excellent and timely reminder of what Pope Francis preaches in *Laudato Sí*, lays out five distinct measures to put us on a path to save the planet:

- harness renewable energies
- limit fishing to a sustainable level
- adopt plant-based diets
- reforest our rainforests
- minimize population growth by raising the standard of living

Like Attenborough, the Pope explains how our consumerism is destroying the magnificent home God created for us. The entire world is interconnected, and our actions have far reaching impacts. We are called to have a healthy relationship with nature, repent for past sins and desire to change our ways.

I highly recommend watching *A Life on Our Planet* (available on Netflix). If you find yourself moved by the exquisite and dramatic footage, I'd also encourage you to read, if you haven't already, *Laudato Sí* (available as a free pdf on the Vatican's website) and experience your own ecological conversion.

declive ambiental. En la década de 2030, las selvas tropicales verán incendios forestales regulares y el ártico estará libre de hielo en los veranos. Para la década de 2040, las nieves perpetuas de las latitudes más altas se derretirán y liberarán metano a la atmósfera. La década de 2050 traerá océanos más cálidos y ácidos que no pueden soportar los arrecifes de coral y las poblaciones de peces se desplomarán. Para la década de 2080, el suelo en todo el mundo estará agotado e incapaz de sustentar a los 11.000 millones de personas proyectadas que vivirán en el planeta. Por último, para 2100 el mundo será 4° C más cálido, grandes partes del mundo serán inhabitables y una extinción masiva estará en marcha.

Afortunadamente, tenemos el control de nuestro futuro. La película ofrece un camino que en gran medida es consistente con las enseñanzas de la Iglesia y el *Laudato Sí* del Papa Francisco. En esencia, la película afirma que debemos restaurar la biodiversidad de la Tierra – "revitalizar el planeta." Attenborough dice que tenemos que "pasar de estar separados de la naturaleza a formar parte de ella una vez más". Del mismo modo, el Papa Francisco escribe: "Hemos olvidado que nosotros mismos somos polvo de la tierra".

La película de Attenborough, un excelente y oportuno recordatorio de lo que el Papa Francisco predica en *Laudato Sí*, propone cinco diversas medidas para ponernos en camino para salvar el planeta:

- aprovechar las energías renovables
- limitar la pesca a un nivel sostenible
- adoptar dietas a base de plantas
- reforestar nuestras selvas tropicales
- minimizar el crecimiento de la población elevando el nivel de vida

Al igual que Attenborough, el Papa explica cómo nuestro consumismo está destruyendo el magnífico hogar que Dios creó para nosotros. El mundo entero está interconectado, y nuestras acciones tienen impactos de gran alcance. Estamos llamados a tener una relación sana con la naturaleza, a arrepentirnos por los pecados del pasado y al deseo de cambiar nuestros caminos.

Recomiendo encarecidamente ver *A Life on Our Planet* (disponible en Netflix). Si te encuentras conmovido por las exquisitas y dramáticas imágenes, también te animaría a leer, si aún no lo has hecho, *Laudato Sí* (disponible como pdf gratuito en el sitio web del Vaticano) y experimentar tu propia conversión ecológica.
